## Who Can Sign the Part 2: In-person Identification Form

When applying for a DoD ECA digital certificate, the “Part 2: In-person Identification Form” must be signed in the presence of a person who is authorized to verify your identity and citizenship. As authorized persons vary depending on the type of DoD ECA certificate you are purchasing, your citizenship and/or where you are geographically located, IdeaTrust has prepared this helpful chart so you are clear as to who is authorized to sign your form.
